### Projected at the International Center of Photography in New York

#### Work added since the conviction of President al-Bashir

**SEPTEMBER 2009** – Art Works Projects is proud to announce that its internationally touring multimedia exhibition DARFUR/DARFUR will be projected at the plaza adjacent to the International Center for Photography while the United Nations General Assembly is in session. With a continually updated body of work, this event marks the first time that DARFUR/DARFUR will include images reflecting the conditions of the region after the conviction of President al-Bashir by the International Criminal Court. With heads of state in New York, this is an optimal time to seek a response from our leaders.



DARFUR/DARFUR has visited over 35 sites around the world including Paris, Berlin, Dakar, Madrid, Stockholm, and Johannesburg. The exhibition features digitally-projected images that expose the ongoing crisis in Darfur through abrupt visual education.

DARFUR/DARFUR will feature the photography of former U.S. Marine Brian Steidle and photojournalists Lynsey Addario, Mark Brecke, Helene Caux, Ron Haviv, Paolo Pellegrin, James Nachtwey, Ryan Spencer Reed, and Michal Safdie, with newly added work by Marcus Bleasdale.
